

FOLLOW UP GUIDE

The follow-up process is an important step and is necessary for communicating with students who may be new to First Priority. Remember to contact any student who made a decision to follow Christ or who may have questions.

1. Collect Response Cards

The follow-up team (at least 2 students): _____
The team is responsible for collecting and sorting through the response cards at the end of the meeting. Completed response cards must be given to student leaders and thrown away after follow up is made. Please report HOPE stories and student attendance numbers to your Campus Coach.

2. Begin Follow-up With Students

After cards have been sorted, please begin the follow-up process with each student who made any type of decision. Student leaders may choose to make contact in person, by a written note/text or email.

HELPFUL TIPS

- Ask students who invited a friend to follow up with them and invite them to HELP Week. Ask those students to call or text them.
- It is a time for encouragement and reinforcement of the decision made in the club.
- Listen more than talk, but be willing to share the summary gospel outline again in 30 seconds.
- Find out if they have a church home. If so, where? If not, invite him/her to yours.
- End the conversation by asking what you can do to help them walk with Jesus. Offer to read the Bible together once a week over lunch at school.
- Pray for them.

Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. (James 5:16)

3. Students Without A Church Home

- Invite them to your church and youth group.
- Offer to read the Bible with them; consider starting in the Gospel of John.
- Help them get to know other believers at school and in the community.

You have an awesome opportunity to help students grow in their faith; do not miss it!
