

Understanding Religious Rights on Public School Campuses [any school that receives federal funds]: Public school teachers, principals, administrators, and other personnel may not:

- promote a particular religion as being superior to any other
- promote religion in general as superior to a secular approach to life
- be antagonistic to religion in general or to a particular religious belief in particular
- be antagonistic to secularism, or advance or inhibit religion

What students can do:

- Pray at school
- Proselytize other students
- Share scriptures with friends
- Bring their Bible to school
- Gather in prayer and in Bible study
- Express deeply held religious convictions
- Express faith based viewpoint in class
- Distribute material with religious themes or words
- Participate in Christian student clubs and have equal access to school facilities, resources, and free speech forums.
- Wear clothing with scripture and religious jewelry [uniform policy may apply]

What students cannot do:

- Disrupt instruction time to pray or share scripture or religious views
- Harass other students
- Ignore school policies

Outside adults must be back ground checked and cleared by the school district before going on campus; may attend a Christian club/group meeting if invited by students; may share his/her faith during the Christian club meeting, if asked to do so by students; cannot pray with students on campus [other than in the Christian club/group meeting]; cannot collect student information or post pictures of students without parent approval.
